Good Morning,

I am writing to you with the purpose of supporting Alex Zerbe, Professional Zaniac, in your artist selection process.

As a school administrator, I have had the benefit of working with Alex for four years. I have enjoyed his educational and riveting performances in the presence of varying audiences. All of them have responded with the same roars of laughter and faces of amazement at aspects of his show! Specifically I have found Alex's performances to be among the best I have hired. Alex's show is energetic, educationally relevant, and uniquely varied in content. Alex is truly multitalented, resulting in a show that few others can pull off with the same quality as Alex.

Alex performed last winter to a school where I am the Principal. My first impression of this, our second meeting, was that Alex was super organized! He had many relevant questions for me designed to precisely address all the preparation required to pull off a flawless show. Alex came onto the stage from the sports equipment room, running down the centre aisle of the audience. Between the music, his energy, and the visually captivating props, he had the whole school, including staff, completely attentive for almost an hour! The laughter never stopped and this fed Alex's energy for the show.

One aspect of his show teachers and other staff appreciated was his ongoing focus on including educationally relevant material in his act. Aspects of science are vividly illuminated as he spins objects upon objects: on fingers, heads, and lucky students from the audience. His care and attention to literacy comes through loud and bassy while he raps and beatboxes about the local library and all the books we can find there. Students remember these aspects of his show and this increases the power behind our teaching the next time we emphasize these learning concepts.

I first learned that Alex was a one-of-a-kind performer when he visited a high school where I was the vice-principal. I met him before the show and in our conversation he was very concerned and attentive about the ways he could adjust his show not only to suit the location of Prince George, but also about how he could adjust the content to be more interesting to the age group of students to whom he was performing. This impressed me, as this is not a common practice of performers we hire. Since then, I have seen students beg for tricks and stunts they have seen before, but I have never seen Alex's repertoire grow stale. He is always sharing new tricks with his audiences.

The last thought I will leave you with is about how Alex so accurately embodies the true lifelong learner: something of great interest to schools. During one performance, I watched Alex explain to the students that he had been attempting a new trick. He further explained that he didn't always nail it and that he may make a mistake in front of the whole school. During the first attempt, Alex did miss a catch. However, he then went on to demonstrate a successful attempt and most importantly model the aspect of 'a learner' we can all benefit from: nothing worthwhile comes without hard work, perseverance, and learning from our mistakes and outtakes. For these reasons, I hope to see Alex as an annually repeating choice on the artists register. When he is available, he will always be my first choice for a balance of funny, skillful, educational, and fresh!
